Unions continue to be active in organizing dealership employees in the Chicago market. To complicate matters, Congress is considering a new law called the **EMPLOYEE FREE CHOICE ACT (EFCA)** that would radically transform the union organizing process and make it **much easier** for a union to organize. Many are predicting that the EFCA **will become law** following the November elections.

The last thing any nonunion dealer wants is to be caught off guard by a union organizing drive. To help make sure dealers are ready if an organizing drive develops, this seminar will examine:

- How does a union get in?
- How will EFCA make it easier for unions to get in?
- What tactics are unions currently using to organize dealership employees?
