- Avoid costly investigations and dispute hearings

Avoid providing legal advice or interpreting the law for families Avoid violating the robust rights of homeless students

Parent

Court-ordered custody

Short-term guardianship

Relative receiving public aid

Responsible adult

Residency – General Education

For reasons other than to have access to the educational programs of the district.

Allison – Special Education



Residency – Special Education

Parent

Parent has guardianship

Court-appointed guardian

DCFS guardianship, student lives w/ parent

Court-ordered residential placement, parents retain rights

Student

Student is 18 and no guardian appointed

Student is emancipated

Location of parent or guardian is unknown

DCFS guardianship, student placed residentially

Multiple properties

Divorced/separated parents

> Doubled-up families

Third party residency





Immigrant Students

This is NOT always homelessness



Homeless Students

Immediate (NO immediate!) Enrollment

Student claiming or providing information suggesting

Sharing Housing/Lacks fixed, regular, adequate nighttime abode

Educational rights notice + connect to liaison + other requirements

Different dispute process; 18 month review

Sensitive Identification



Districts have an affirmative responsibility to identify all homeless students



In most instances, families will not say that they are homeless



Staff should identify common signs of homelessness




Double check all families that are sharing housing to rule out homelessness

Choice of School

- 1. School of Origin
 - Attended when permanently housed
 - Last enrolled
- 2. School of Attendance Area
 - Where the student currently resides
